



## AmeriCorps Service Member Position with TerraCorps & Charles River Conservancy

TerraCorps is a nonprofit organization working at the intersection of land conservation, sustainable farming, and local food systems to build local nonprofit capacity while growing the next generation of emerging leaders committed to making a difference at the community level. We value the power of local nonprofits to best understand and serve their communities, and our goal is to help them succeed by providing them access to the AmeriCorps national service model to build organizational capacity.

TerraCorps partners with a network of nonprofits in Massachusetts and Rhode Island focused on community needs related to local land conservation and sustainable agriculture. These partners act as service sites for a new cohort of AmeriCorps service members annually. Service members are paired with a site supervisor who provides guidance and mentorship while they learn to manage community programs and projects over a 1,700-hour service term. **The 2026–27 service year runs September 8, 2026, to July 30, 2027.**



Charles River Conservancy is interviewing candidates for a Land Stewardship Coordinator (LSC). The LSC will engage with the Stewardship and Volunteer Program Manager to manage volunteers on community service projects, educate or train individuals in environmental stewardship or environmentally conscious practices, and complete three capacity building projects. Potential projects include:

- Collaborate with state and community partners to expand and strengthen the Charles River Environmental Watch (CREW) program by training and supporting volunteers to independently conduct river stewardship activities such as trash cleanup, invasive species management, vegetation monitoring, and hazard reporting.
- Lead volunteer groups in performing park stewardship activities such as bench repair and painting, litter removal, invasive species management, and shrub and tree maintenance.
- Support the Annual Charles River Earth Day Cleanup by helping recruit, coordinate, and manage the hundreds of volunteers participating in this large-scale community stewardship event organized in partnership with local park groups.
